Problem

Clients spend too much time waiting for treatment when they could be in treatment elsewhere.

Solution

Refer clients elsewhere so that they can be seen right away.

Daybreak Youth Services in Spokane, Washington and **Perinatal Treatment Services (PTS)** in Seattle, Washington collaborated to cross-refer adolescent females who needed residential addiction treatment. PTS had open beds for publicly funded girls while Daybreak was trying to achieve a more balanced mix of privately and publicly funded clients and had a waiting list. • Referring clients elsewhere will not help improve the business case, but it will ensure that clients do not have unrealistic expectations about entering treatment quickly.
