




NIATx Process Improvement Model

- 2. How will we know that a change is an improvement?
- 3. What changes can we test that will result in an improvement?








- Goal: adopting data-driven process improvement as a public health business practice to increase access and retention in care.
- 23 agencies using *Plan, Do, Study, Act* change cycle.
- First 15 months data showed 37% reduction in waiting days; 18% improvement in retention; 17% increase in treatment completion.








Trialability: CTN Exposure Appears to Increase Use of Medications (N=871)




Key Elements for Diffusion of an Innovation

- Observability





Changing Public Health Business Practices Means Changing Organizational Culture

Culture: Commonly-held attitudes, beliefs, and practices of incumbents.*

- Perceived common sense/the tried & true way we do things
- Socially reinforced (Resistant to change; but once changed is durable).

Process improvement provides tools to keep the culture from stagnating.

EPIDEMIOLOGY RESEARCH BRANCH

DESPR seeks to improve the nation's public health by promoting integrated approaches to understand and address interactions between individuals and environments that contribute to the continuum of problems related to drug use.

Our goal is to develop scientific knowledge with clear application to practice and public policy.



DESPR: Major Research Questions

- 1. What **new theoretical approaches** can inform our research?
- 2. What intrapersonal and environmental factors interact with each other and with genetic factors across development?
- 3. How can we <u>blend science and services</u> to measurably <u>impact public health outcomes</u>?

New Research Program at NIDA: Improvement Strategies for Addiction Tx (NIATx study)

Grant: DA020832, \$7.5million over 5 years Principal Investigator: David Gustafson Primary Question: How much support is needed to implement NIATx effectively?

New Research Program at NIDA: Improvement Strategies for Addiction Tx (NIATx study)

Design: Approximately 200 agencies in 5 States randomized to different levels of support (materials alone, web-based interest circles, coaching calls and visits, etc.)

Outcomes: Treatment no-show rates, ongoing retention in treatment, sustainability of effects, employee turnover

Summary: NIATx is a <u>new paradigm</u> for improving clinical care.

NIATx fits into treatment services research as part of a growing emphasis on organization and management research by testing and adopting public health business models within drug treatment. ovement of Addiction Treatment
